or most kids, enjoying a family BBQ, an outdoor adventure or attending a fun workshop is part of normal childhood development and growing up in a healthy community. However for children who are marginalized or at risk, these opportunities are not easy to come by – activities that we often take for granted can be costly for families who cannot pay for them. Sometimes, parents who are struggling with responsibility and life skills don't realize that these activities are an important part of growing up.

At Extreme Outreach, we believe that kids need to work and play with each other in a safe, happy environment and under the guidance of healthy role models. They need to do the things that build lifelong skills and qualities; to develop spiritually, socially, physically and cognitively. Our hope is that they build confidence and can grow into healthy, happy adults who radiate with joy, live productive lives and serve others in return.

Year after year, we have had seen huge successes with 2 programs in particular — our weekly BBQ and the Superkids programs. These 2 ministries give us the opportunity to regularly connect with at-risk children, youth, their families and their community. Because we aim to develop long-term relationships, visiting the children on an ongoing basis is an important factor in the success of our programs.

One of our greatest rewards is when through ministry, we get to witness the kids grow – from small children to teenagers and finally young adults. This is the case with Alonzo, who we interview on page 5. Founder Cliff Power met Alonzo when he was 8 years old, growing up in Blanshard Courts. A regular at our weekly BBQs, he has also joined us in many Superkids Camps and adventures. Over the span of 12 years, Cliff developed a friendship and a spiritual connection with him. Today, he is a stable young man who volunteers with Extreme

BBQ Ministry

ur weekly BBQ ministry is held at low cost housing complex that is home to many at-risk children and youth. Cliff Power has been doing ministry at this location for over 10 years, and it is from his BBQ cart that he has developed many life-long relationships, while inspiring children to cook and co-operate with each other. The BBQ is full of fun, energy and happiness as the children and their community gather to eat and play together.

The BBQ starts with some of the regular attendee volunteers, eagerly waiting for Cliff to pull up in the bus and unload supplies. From there, they help with everything from putting smokies on the grill, to setting up buns and treats. The children are taught how to cook safely and with the best sanitary practices, giving them confidence that they can take home to their own families. While they take turns on the BBQ, they get to connect with Cliff and the other Outreach Volunteers, while joking around with each other and having fun.

When the food is ready, the children blow a horn letting the rest of the community know that it's eating time! Siblings, parents and friends come to the small square where they are handed their food, which they have anticipated the whole day. In some cases, this will be the first and/or only meal of the day. It is also one of the only times that the whole community comes together like this.

Alonzo Ross-Machado Interview

ne of Cliff Power's very first BBQ helpers is Alonzo Ross-Machado. When they first met at a Blanshard Courts BBQ, Alonzo was 8 years old. He is now 20 years old and a regular volunteer with Extreme Outreach. The 2 have a lifelong connection that you can hear in their warm, reminiscent conversations.

Recently, Cliff and Alonzo sat down to talk about the many adventures that they've had together, at the BBQ, doing community service and in the Superkids program. Alonzo's story is a great example of the power of building relationship via ministry.

CLIFF: How old were you when you started?

ALONZO: I was 8

CLIFF: And what was it like waiting after school knowing the BBQ was coming? You helped out a lot?

ALONZO: Yeah I did. I really looked forward to the Wednesday's getting out to see a bunch of the other kids in the neighborhood. I had a lot of hard times getting to know the kids my age, I always felt like I got along with older people a lot better, and the BBQ just helped me get the mix of both of them. I was able to play with everybody at the same time.

CLIFF: When you were younger, I would just stand back and let you run the whole BBQ. What was that like for you?

ALONZO: I just I felt like king of the world. Being able to tell people "we are going to need more because there is a big line up coming" - it just felt good to be in control for a bit.

CLIFF: And what was Superkids like?

ALONZO: Superkids was something completely different. It was like afterschool care, except the things you're learning there are really going to matter later on in life. Compared to what you normally learn in say school – you know, being able to color inside of the lines.

CLIFF: We went surfing, so what were the surf trips like for you?

ALONZO: Well they were always interesting. You had all the characters going on every trip, it was more like a

TV show then anything else. It was one big comedy for almost a week straight, where you're just hanging out with everybody that you like, and playing jokes on them - just having fun. It was nice.

CLIFF: Remember when we rescued the 2 boogie boarders?

ALONZO: I don't think I will ever see anything like that ever again. We didn't even know what we were doing, just trying to climb down the rocks to just reach for them. (Alonzo and Cliff both laugh)

CLIFF: Tell me what you remember about the Christmas

ALONZO: I remember not only the party's, but also going out and handing out the stockings. That was some of the most memorable things because we would get to hear your stories about some of the people you knew back in the day, people that are still around just kickin' it.

CLIFF: What was it like for when we go around and serve the street people - drug addicts and what not. Did it help you choose not to do drugs?

ALONZO: It did, but more than anything it made me realize that they are the same as us, they just need a little more help, they just need that hand to show them exactly where to go.

CLIFF: Now you've grown up quite a bit, you're graduated and a 2nd year electrical apprentice. So all in all looking back on it, how can you sum it up in one sentence?

ALONZO: I don't think there is a sentence you can use to explain it in one go. I mean, I don't know how to explain it, it was so much fun, kind of scary at times too. But no matter what, we just kept going and everything turned out great. It is great.

CLIFF: So was it a positive experience all those years?

"Oh, for sure. And its not like the experience ever ends, even now you've got me coming back and helping out, and I wouldn't want to do anything else."

Children's Program Director's Message

e had another great year with the kids at our Superkids Saturdays program with 130 kids registered between the ages of 6-I2. Each Saturday starts with a ride on the lively Superkids Bus. Once we arrive, the day is filled with games, songs, creative activities, Bible stories, a healthy lunch, and special events. We have a scripture memory verse as well as different themes each week such as; mission impossible, rainbow day, crazy hair day, etc - which makes it extra fun! This year West Coast Waffle blessed us to take the kids for dinner free of charge.

Cliff and I are so thankful for the privilege it is to provide a safe and fun atmosphere where the kids in Victoria can come and feel at home. There is a big need for this and we love to plant positive seeds in the lives of each child, which will later help them make healthy choices in their lives. Each child is a work of art, a beautiful creation, and we love to bless and call forth the uniqueness and gifting in each one. Jesus said, "Let the little children come unto me" in Mt. 19:14, which is at the heart of Superkids. After gaining inspiration from this verse, I wrote a song called "Jesus loves the little children." The chorus is "Jesus loves the little children, He loves to run and play, in His garden with them laughing, as children may they remain, as children may they ever be."

We are thankful for our wonderful volunteer team composed of adults, youth and families who have joined us in this vision and have been a real blessing! At our next Superkids event, we will be hosting the Superkids and their families at Lion Of Judah's annual Back Yard Bash in June, followed by our annual Superkids camp on July 21–25.

Level Ground Coffee – Connecting the Dots from Local to Global

here aren't many packages of coffee beans that have a picture of a smiling farmer on them, and that's because there aren't many companies that make farmers smile quite the way that Level Ground Trading does. By developing direct trade relationships that empower the growers, the Company has purchased the harvests from over 5000 farmers in 10 different Countries (2014). This is often in places where farmers and their communities are victim to resource wars and other challenges that accompany living in poverty. Not only does Level Ground uplift Globally, they also have an awesome approach to running their business locally. We recently sat down with co-owner Stacey Toews, and he told us more about how Level Ground makes people all over the world smile.

Level Ground was started by 2 families coming together in 1997. It was clear from the beginning that the vision was one of a "holistic approach to business." They didn't want to be known as just another coffee Company. Rather, they wanted to be a Company that supported their community, the environment and farmers across the world. This values based approach can be seen firsthand with a visit to Level Ground's facility in Saanichton, which is landfill free with 13 streams of recycling that all 30 employees are encouraged to use, free of charge. There has been no Level Ground garbage added to a landfill since 2005. Staff are also paid to cycle, ride the bus or carpool to work each day, reducing fossil fuel dependency and creating a happier and healthier workplace. Despite this already fantastic sustainable approach to running the business, Stacey is often found asking visitors if they can offer ideas on how Level Ground can improve and be more thoughtful, doing more with less. The company also hopes to inspire other businesses to operate in a sustainable, holistic way.

As we zoom out and think globally, Level Ground shifts its focus from the challenges of the Ist world to the more complex challenges of the 3rd world, with hopes to conjoin them in a more meaningful and direct way. Whatever a person's belief or religious faith, people share a "values based" connection with Level Ground. Here, Stacey explains what galvanizes him to do this work:

"I believe that God deeply loves people that are poor. And when I look at history I see him having a very prejudicial bias toward people who are one the margins of society. So it became a real mission for me and our business partners as we worked together to see how we could respond with everyday people who work super hard but who are usually pushed to the margins of society. And one of the classic groups of people we see around the world living that way, and struggling, are farmers. Usually no one is upset with a farmer; no one is ticked off with what he or she is doing or how they're doing it. They are often the people who are sustaining creation, stewarding the environment and feeding their neighbours. But when there are ideological groups that are toting machine guns and people being displaced by rural violence, mining and forestry companies coming in and taking land, and trying to rape it for resources, farmers get pushed further to the margins."

Level Ground has developed relationships with over small-scale producer groups in 10 countries. These are often groups of farmers that are loosely structured, or they might be more formally structured, such as a co-op. Usually, there are hundreds, and sometimes there are more than 1000 in a group. The farmers often have a couple of

acres of land where they grow food to feed their family, and sell to the local market. In most cases, there is risk of losing the land due to regional issues that put pressure on those who are given fewer human rights. And while the farmers are growing food, they are still earning barely enough to cover the cost of services like access to school or medical care. This is where Level Ground Trading has stepped in to empower the farmers and their communities, on their own terms. Via regular visits and ongoing trade relationships, the Company partners long-term with the farmer groups, to accomplish what they hope to achieve in their community.

"When you are living in abject poverty you don't get to dream. You're just trying to get enough calories to stay alive. Our goal is to create a long-term relationship with the farmers, where trust is established and there is open, transparent dialogue. Out of that we can hear what their dreams are for the future.

We are not sponsoring farmers, we don't go in with donations, and it's not a lottery where they just happen to win money and they don't know how to repeat it. Instead, we work closely with them to ensure that their success is tied directly with the product. If it's high quality, it is paid for with a good price. This way, they have a reliable way to get their product out of the country and a reliable way to earn income for their hard work. So when they know that there is a purchase coming next year, when they are tending their vines or soil this year, they make really good choices for the environment. They get to plan ahead and dream in a way that has never existed before.

There are crazy cool things that happen in a community where a farmer, for the first time ever, has a promise from another business that for the next year that their harvest is spoken for. If the people who grow the food and steward the lands are looked after, their children get to attend school and they can access health care. When you stabilize farming families, you stabilize communities."

Apart from working with coffee farmers, Level Ground has some new and exciting trade partnership plans. They are working on heirloom rice grown by indigenous people of the Philippines, coconut oil, organic spices, organic cane sugar, dried tropical fruits and vanilla beans from Uganda. Clearly, Level Ground is about connecting the dots – from the farmer in a remote region across the world, to local sustainability, and finally to your delicious cup of warm, soothing coffee. And speaking of that, did you know that the stories on the coffee packages are actually about real people? And, those people are fairly paid to share their stories, their smiles and their photos. Also, Level Ground staff includes a mother of 4 who was once a seamstress in Iran. Her work is part of their upcycling program, where each month, thousands of used coffee packages are turned into value added totes.

In a world so in need of these types of businesses, it's no wonder that the Company is admired by both coffee drinkers and growers alike.

A Life Enriched - The Story of Pat Humble

y name is Pat Humble, and I am the Director at The Salvation Army. I'm not only the Director; I have also been a client. When people come into my office with feelings of hopelessness, we swap chairs and I am able to share a story of hope and healing – my own story.

I grew up in the *Blanshard Courts. We juggled between welfare and whatever work my parents could find. Life was pretty tough, and at the age of 16 I was kicked out of my home. It was The Salvation Army that was always there to catch me when I fell, or when I felt my life was spinning out of control.

There were a few special people that prayed for me and hugged me whenever things were hard. Sometimes these people would put me to work, and I would earn my way to The Salvation Army camps and retreats. I believe that through it all, God handcrafted me with a passion to serve. He held me close as he allowed me to experience some suffering first hand, on my own journey. This eventually gave me empathy and the courage to stand up and fight for those that are vulnerable.

This quote has been an inspiration to me:

In 1997, I was presented with the opportunity to work for The Salvation Army, and I have been there ever since. Employment through The Salvation Army gave me the opportunity to "make a new ending," to walk alongside,

and learn from folks living on the streets. Through the soup kitchens, I have had the privilege of sharing meals and stories with others. I've had the opportunity to help vulnerable people when facing eviction, deportation, jail time, being turned away from hospitals, restaurants, parks and more. Some of my deepest learning has been through listening to the stories of others, meeting them at their point of need and walking alongside them through thick and thin, until they could stand on their own and we could celebrate together.

Today, I am the Director at The Salvation Army Stan Hagen Centre for Families – I survived!

I invite you to come in any time and speak to one of our caring staff, share your story and start to create your new ending — one that begins with hope.



Thank you to everyone who donated food, finances and the occasional hug.













Let's Celebrate Recovery Together!

he first time I met Cliff Power (Founder – Extreme Outreach), he was standing behind a BBQ preparing smokies. He had big hair and an even bigger smile. I was stumbling out of a Holiday Court Hotel room, where I had been using drugs for over 18 hours. Through 1998-99 I would visit that BBQ several times, devouring the food from the grill. Some may scoff at those serving food to a desperate world, but it was that very service that would interrupt my life the following year.

In the early spring of 2000, I found myself down at the Whale Wall, beside the Johnson Street Bridge, in a soup line up outside of a little mini van. Week in and week out, Mark, Remona and their 6 kids dispensed soup, buns and encouragement. The family was ridiculously generous by bringing a homeless and hopelessly addicted man into their house, and even more so by bringing a lost soul to their church. And so at 27 years of age, after hearing a gospel message and an invitation to receive salvation, I gave my life to Christ. I wept and cried out as this God I never knew convinced my heart that he had always known me. I literally sobered up on the same day, and almost 14 years later have never looked back.

Christ opens doors for the willing. Within days of my decision for Him, I was invited to live in a Christian liferecovery house where I began attending I2-step meetings. Soon after, I walked into the doors of the church closest to my house, Glad Tidings. I joined the choir right away. I was raw but on fire for Jesus, and he met me right where I was.

A recovery ministry at Glad Tidings grew out of a great need. Broken people - Christian or not, required a safe place to express the challenges they faced, to discover the real healing power of God. Celebrate Recovery (CR) became like the operating room of the church, where every message, every testimony, every small group focused on transformation and healing. While we began as an alcohol

and drug recovery group, people began finding freedom from a diverse range of issues.

During my time with Celebrate Recovery, I have witnessed many miracles. Almost 3 years ago, a woman in the grip of Bulimia and near death, came to her very first CR group confessing her heart to the women present. The bondage was immediately broken, and today she leads a powerful Woman's Food Issues Group!

In the case of addictions, a man had seemingly lost all hope of breaking the sin of internet pornography. Yet with the help of CR, he has just celebrated 30 months of freedom from lust, and has pioneered an amazing Men's Sexual Issues Group. Another man, previously addicted to heroin for over 25 years, recently took a 2-year sobriety medallion.

Co-dependency, trauma and abuse, financial issues, this list goes on. We have 7 issue and gender specific small groups that meet every Friday evening after worship.

Recovery is also for the families: Terry Opperman and her team lead "The Landing," which is like CR for teenagers. We also have an excellent weekly children's program, where parents can focus on their issues while kids are busy being kids. The ministry is non-denominational and participants from churches throughout the city attend. Many who enter our doors are searching, seeking and wondering not only if God exists, but also if He could actually help them. Everyone is welcome and hope truly abounds in this confidential, non-judgemental and safe environment. Visit: celebraterecovery.ca


