his winter, as one little eight-year-old girl handed in her registration form for our Superkids Saturday program, she handed in a second one for Superkids Summer Camp, which was more than six months away. When we asked her if she had accidentally filled in the wrong form she said no, she just wanted to make sure there was definitely room for her at camp again!

It's stories like these that make us excited to be planning our annual Superkids Summer Camp up at Sooke's Camp Barnard, which provides an incredible camp experience for local children who often can't otherwise afford to go.

We treasure the gold mine of growth opportunities that camp presents; it builds confidence in kids, as they have a chance to sleep out in a cabin, hike awesome trails, take leadership roles in various activities, try new sports, and make new friends.

Unfortunately, not every child in Victoria has the chance to go to camp, as prices often soar way above what is possible for many families to afford. Extreme Outreach's Superkids Summer Camp attempts to keep costs low by finding a sponsor for every child that attends: just \$200 provides one child's transportation to and from camp, four nights and five days at camp, all meals, the cost of a cabin, a T-shirt and gift bag, and all extracurricular activities.

Last year, we welcomed kids from all walks of life, dealing with all sorts of home situations. One nine-year-old girl was dealing with several traumatic situations in her family when she came to camp. In these cases, camp offers a week for a child to relax, and to have a chance to feel like a care-free kid. We also had a ten year-old camper who was pretty troubled when we first welcomed him through our "high-five highway" at camp. He was dealing with an absent parent and very low self esteem, but throughout the week we spent time showing him he was loved and involved him with leadership and other responsibilities. By the end of the week, he was offering to stay behind and help after meals, and was much calmer and far more confident then when we



met him. Camp provides an awesome week of making friends and growing in confidence in a safe and loving environment, as well as a chance to experience the great outdoors. For some, it offers a chance to discover life-saving tools that they learn to apply in their lives.

He was dealing with an absent parent and very low self esteem, but throughout the week we spent time showing him he was loved and involved him with leadership and other responsibilities.

Once a Superkid, always a Superkid

art of what makes our **Superkids** program unique is that kids don't ever grow out of being a Superkid. Since the program has been running for over ten years, we have relationships with several kids who have grown up in the program and surpassed the age-12 limit. Rather than saying goodbye, however, we create the opportunity for kids to continue to be mentored and to learn how to be a mentor by bringing them along as Junior Leaders and then Senior Leaders. One young woman, who started as a Superkid around age six, is now fourteen. Last camp, we brought her on board as part of our cleaning team (not super glamorous but still leaving enough extra time to hang at the lake and join in campfire and games!). She sent us the following comments afterwards:

Superkids has taught me a lot how to treat myself and others. I think if it weren't for Cliff and the whole organization, I wouldn't care about much. It's like he took me under his wing before I became a troubled teen and there's no way I could ever be able to thank him with words. 99

We are so proud of this young lady, who made the honor roll in her high school classes this year and continues to come out and volunteer with us.

Story of a former Superkid

grew up with the Superkids program. When I was five I started going to the BBQs and then eventually Superkids started up every Saturday at a church up the hill from my house. Cliff started running camp and it was something I looked forward to every year. I remember bunking with my friends in the cabin; I never wanted to go home. Camp was a place where I could be a kid and not have to worry about what would happen to me the next day. I was safe and that was the feeling I liked the most. Growing up with the BBQs, Superkids, and camp has helped me grow into a stronger person. I was able to see that there was a way to have a normal life without lies and spite but with love and honesty. Now I am 17 years old and I am living a positive life. Every year I try to help out at the camp and try to help and care for these kids who are and were just like me when I was younger. Cliff used to tell me, 'sometimes you need to be the light that outshines the darkness' and I strongly believe this is true.




Update from our BBQ Outreach

We delivered her stocking, along with 1200 others, to many individuals who we believe truly need to know they are cared for during the holiday season. We're so excited for next year!

Some students have participated for all four years of their high school and have been able to get to know some of the children and families quite well! We got in touch with Laurie Parker, the Community Service Coordinator at St. Michaels, to give us an update on her fantastic volunteers:

The students who participate are from all kinds of backgrounds. Many of them have volunteered for other organizations in the past, but they get a real sense of community and belonging to something important with Extreme Outreach. It is such a special feeling at the BBQs and they leave feeling very positive! The volunteers look forward to going out each week and often recruit their friends to come and help. They really make a connection with the children and try to come up with new games and ways of having fun together. Whether the day is sunny, rainy, or even snowy, they make the most of it!

EVER WONDER HOW Extreme Outreach Society got started



Before becoming the founder and director of Extreme Outreach Society, Cliff Power was living in Victoria, BC and running a company called Creative Drywall and Painting. In 1998, he began to have a strong burden on his heart for the people who lived at Holiday Court Motel, one of the main epicenters of crime in Victoria. The motel was previously a tired tourist hotel but had become the unofficial transition house for the drug addicted, prostituted, and just plain out of luck. When Cliff's pastor at the time, David Hixson of Victoria Harvest, committed his church to pay the rent for room 21, Cliff quit his drywall career and moved in permanently. His goal was to simply love the residents there, and yet much more began to happen. Slowly he gained the trust of people in the motel, and their lives began to change.

In 2000, Extreme Outreach Society was ratified as a legal society with the mission of feeding, clothing, and loving the vulnerable people at Holiday Court Motel. As volunteers began showing up to assist Cliff with his ministry, Extreme Outreach began to grow.

The first BBQ ministry began at Holiday Court Motel outside of room 21, when Cliff would grill up burgers for hungry tenants to eat a real meal for free, and he began to build relationships by providing a consistent, loving presence on the property. Soon, the constant police presence, overdoses, and fights were beginning to fade, until eventually they were no longer present. After an amazing five years of ministry, Holiday Court Motel was eventually sold and torn down.

Cliff turned his attention to a nearby low-income housing development that has been a breeding ground for teen drug users in the past. He began his BBQ ministry on the basketball courts at a school nearby, hoping to build relationships with vulnerable teens who might be considering or already dealing with drug abuse. Instead, what he found was an entire community of young children potentially at risk due to their surroundings. Through the BBQ ministry he began meeting their families and connecting them with churches and ministries in the area.

Around this time, Extreme Outreach purchased eight houses on McKenzie Avenue and began renting to people who wanted to stay off drugs and needed a safe, drug-free place to do so. The ministry was still primarily focused on adults at this time, but also continued to do BBQs and Superkids outreaches for the children.

Eventually, Extreme Outreach sold the recovery houses and paid off the \$2.3 million loan, providing a fresh start for their new season. The addiction recovery house ministry was closed down, and Extreme Outreach turned its entire focus to preventing homelessness and addiction by focusing on children between the ages of six and 12. We still refer people in addiction to established treatment centers and provide a list of resources on our website.

Today, Extreme Outreach Society is a fully functioning non-profit organization with the mission to provide holistic development and mentorship to local children at risk in a safe, positive, and non-discriminatory environment. Extreme continues to run a variety of programs and ministries that welcome kids from all walks of life, teaching them valuable life skills that they might not receive at home. These programs include Superkids Saturdays, summer camp, various Extreme Adventures, a BBQ cart ministry, and two large community Christmas dinners for families in need. All ministries are focused on providing the same thing that was needed in 1998 at Holiday Court Motel: **HOPE**.
